An an official vote was conducted today by among the principle officials (Robert Browne [45% voting power], Craig Hassapakis [45% voting power], and Howard Clark [10% voting power). Myself and Howard have decided for the dissolution of the ARC corporation that Robert had formulated in Belize with a 55% vote in the affirmative for the dissolution. Howard and I will continue to work on ARC but Robert is no longer involved with the official functioning of ARC in any way.

The below is not a legal letter but a statement of position from a conciliatory aspect.

It is unfortunate that you have taken this stance as if continued it means that the ARC is effectively put out of business until the legal situation is clarified and resolved.

In the interests of the ARC and our authors I am happy to continue the ARC as previous to your email below

Unless you retract this stance immediately, the ARC to be legally responsible must stop any new activities or commitments until the situation is legally resolved.

Shall I as official Business Manager, a position approved by you, contact all current authors on articles concerning our position.

As the ARC is committed to multiple parties, I suggest that as a responsible alternative that we decide on a future end date for the ARC, before legal proceedings begin to enable us to fulfill our immediate commitments.

The below is email does not express an "official" vote as it does not comply to legal requirements.



Craig if you want to continue on this path please send any legal documents to me so that I can get my US lawyers to consider my and my projects position in respect to the ARC.

My and my projects legal positions are two separate matters. I will discuss these with my US solicitor.

It is unfortunate that the path you are following Craig will result in Howard losing almost any claim to the value of his previous work in the ARC.

It is also unfortunate that as it stands Howard may be liable, as you will, for any costs demanded by me in respect to breach of contract if you and he "take over" the ARC.

I also believe that Howard may be liable for all costs if you default in any debts to me through your "take over" of the ARC.

In any case Craig, can you make it quite clear what your stance is through a legal letter, perhaps best prepared by a solicitor.

I am sorry that Howard that after all your hard work and commitment that you have been dragged into this difficult situation.
